Inspection results summary:

Operations continuing within phase 3, with the material that was temporarily stored to the north of the void (in the wet weather) now transferred into the void and deposits again taking place directly.

Phase 4 was walked as part of this monitoring visit. It appeared as if some additional material had been spread here. Whilst it is acknowledged that further works are needed to fully restore this area, it was noted that the surface of Phase 4, in places, contained quite a bit of rubble. It is considered that these areas may need to be picked before any further material is deposited to ensure successful restoration to agriculture in due course.

Operations, otherwise, generally appeared to be progressing well and as per the approved permission.

The CPA recently had received some enquiries/complaints about operations on-going or more specifically the number of HGV movements going to / coming from the site. This was discussed with the operator who denied exceeding the vehicle limit, imposed as part of the extant permission, and provided copies of their weighbridge records, over a couple of random recent weeks, as evidence to collate this.

The operator also confirmed the site gates are not opened before 7am and was therefore surprised by the suggestion of BP Mitchell vehicles being seen on the roads in the locality as early as 5:30am.

No significant signs of debris were noted on the roundabout at the site access. Some debris/verge damage was noted along Hall Road/Henham Road. However, as per previous monitoring reports, there are a number of sites in the vicinity and as such it is accepted that this damage may be resulting from other sites.
