Actions from last site visit:

Officer comment/update: Application ref: ESS/07/20/TEN – 'Continuation of winning and working of minerals associated with the construction of a public water storage reservoir without compliance with condition 2 (approved details), condition 34 (restoration/permission end date) and condition 39 (no additional buildings, fixed plant or machinery) attached to application ref: ESS/57/04/TEN to allow changes to operational areas, the phasing of the development and the shape and capacity of the completed reservoir; an additional period of time to complete the development; the provision of an additional car parking area; a new workshop building; and the installation and use of a bagging facility' has now been resolved to be granted planning permission subject to the completion of a Deed of Variation to the legal agreement pursuant to Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) secured as part of the determination of ESS/57/04/TEN. Discussions in this regard are on-going between the Council's legal team and the operator.

Inspection results summary:

The access point to the site off Old Ipswich Road and the haul road were clean. The 'diverted' route of Footpath 19 was closed at the time of visit, with the operator considering this, as a route, now unsafe for users. A diverted (eastwards) route around the reservoir was signposted as a replacement and it understood discussions are on-going with Essex Highways – Public Rights of Way team in respect of this.

With regard to the site, and operations on-going, stockpiles of sand and gravel within the processing area and stockpiles associated with the recycled aggregate operation were well contained.

The concrete plant and bagging facility were both operational at the time of visit but both tidy.

Excavation works have been continuing in Phase J, with this phase now at its full extent of working (towards the Wick Lane boundary) and works progressing into Phase I.

No significant issues or areas of concern noted.

- Annual water monitoring (legal obligation of ESS/57/04/TEN).
